Council of the Province (CoP), Paris, November 17-18

Over the last few months, regional superiors have consulted confreres on the implications of the new Statutes. The CoP was a collective opportunity to explore the thoughts and concerns raised. Some concerns are specific to the needs and circumstances of particular countries and others have a more general application across the province. A key element in the new organisation is the redistribution of roles and responsibilities and this was considered in more detail –

who does what, and how is it done! This needs to be known in order to facilitate a smooth transition from one way of organising the “Work of Mary” in Europe to another on 1 July 2016. To make this happen many more conversations will take place over the coming months before regional superiors report back to the CoP in April 2016. While the province is being reorganised, the ordinary life of confreres continues and the CoP heard echoes from communities, of vocation promotion, apostolic activities, the provincial review of the vow of poverty, collaboration between the Marist units of Africa and Europe, preparations for the Bicentenary 1816-2016 celebrations, the laity gathering in Los Negrales, Spain, feedback from the Annual Review Consultation (ARC) and provincial committees and finally of course, finance.

We pray for all those who lost their lives in the enormous tragedy in Paris, 13 November. We pray for the other people devastated by these actions, the victims' families and friends, and for the men and women who risked their own lives as they reached out in the service of others.

Missionary and Vocational Week in Marconia, Italy, 3 – 9 November, 2015

For several years now Luigi Savoldelli (It) and Sr Beatriz Matos (smsm) have animated a week of reflection and activities in two of the schools in Marconia, Southern Italy. The theme this year was “On the side of the poor”, a theme chosen by the Italian Bishops’ Conference for World Mission Day. Participants, both students and teachers from the high schools Istituto Alberghiero and Istituto Agrario, reported that they were particularly touched by the gospel reflection on the story of the poor man Lazarus. The week was also marked by the fact that Sr Marie Chantal (smsm), well known by them over the last two years while she was living in the Marist Missionary sister’s community of Marconia, is to depart on mission.
