GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

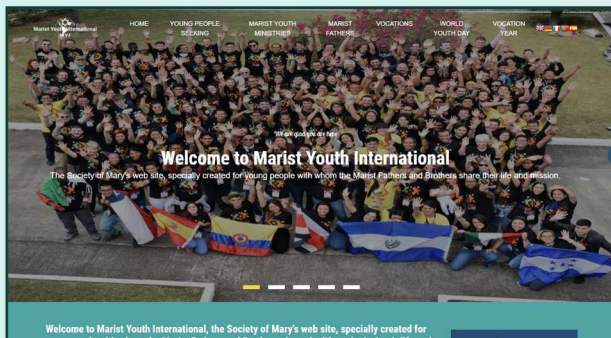

This week Fr John Larsen was present at the international joint USG/UISG (zoom) meeting, comprising for the first time ever Superiors General from both female and male congregations from around the world. More than 250 participants connected with each other for three days. The theme of the meeting was "Consecrated life at the service of Fraternity in a wounded world".

Frs John Larsen and Ben McKenna will embark on their first intercontinental travel since the beginning of the pandemic. In June they will join our African confreres in Cameroon at the time of their District Chapter.
