## DRINKING WATER FOR KANOSIA



A new water supply system was installed at Kanosia, Papua New Guinea, to serve the Primary and High School and the local community. During a joyful ceremony the bishop of Bereina, Mgr. Otto Separy, blessed the water supply in presence of Fr Violeti Tuione, the Parish Priest of Kanosia, Vicar General of the Diocese and Chairperson of the school's Board, Fr Ambrose Kakatai who is a teacher in the school, and the children of the school. The project is an important improvement for the local community as it will provide them with clean drinking water. It was funded by *Wateraid*, a worldwide NGO whose mission is to transform the lives of the poorest and most marginalised people by improving access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene.

## A MARIST SCHOOL IN BURUNDI

Fr Albert Kabala, the District Superior of Africa is currently in Burundi to visit the Marist community and to follow up on the progress made in the building of a Marist school in Musaga, in the periphery of Bujumbura. It is a very poor area and the people are in need of several essential infrastructures, especially schools. In the evening, many young people of the neighborhood come to the courtyard of our Marist community to study. The school should be operative from next September and will serve children of maternity, primary and secondary level.
