The major superiors and vicars of the Provinces of Oceania and New Zealand, and the major superiors of the Districts of Australia and Asia, met together in Sydney over May 21-23 for the annual meeting of MAP (Marist Asia Pacific). They were kept busy with a full agenda including: pre-novitiate formation, international formation and the ongoing formation of the recently ordained; “Omnes Gentes” communities, professional standards and safeguarding, arrangements for and status of members living and/or working in another unit; cooperation in ministries and projects; the influence of the Society’s Commissions on life of units; agenda items for the 2024 ARC meeting and preparation for the General Chapter. The opportunity was also taken for conversations between individual unit leaders on matters of mutual concern.

GERRY ARBUCKLE AWARDED

On 18 May, Australian Catholic University awarded Marist author-anthropologist, Fr Gerald Arbuckle sm with the ACU's honorary Doctorate of the University. Accompanying the award, a citation states this degree 'is the highest honor the university can bestow' and is in recognition of Gerry's 'contribution to the academic tradition of the Church and for bringing the interplay between faith and reason to bear on complex religious and social policy issues for the betterment of society.'
