- The Superior General is departing from Rome on Sunday. His first stop will be in Australia where he will visit the International *Omnes Gentes* Community in Marayong and also meet with Fr Tony Corcoran, the District Superior of Australia. In February and March he will carry out the visitation of the Province of New Zealand. Before returning to Rome he will also visit the Marist community in San Francisco.
